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What will happen to after-Gaza War? - True feelings and nature of the stakeholders



The Gaza War began with a surprise attack on an Israeli settlement by Hamas on October 7th, 2023. Israeli army scorched northern Gaza immediately and marched on the southern cities to destroy Hamas' underground tunnels overwhelmingly. Now tragic urban war is being continued. The death toll on the Palestinian side exceeds 20,000, including women and children. Many hostages held by Hamas have not been released. There is no sign of a ceasefire in sight. Time passes by with the paralyzed United Nations Security Council. The difference in military powers between the Israeli army and Hamas is quite huge. Everyone can agree that the war will eventually end with Israel's victory. However, it is unclear what form Gaza will take after the war.

Let's explore the true feelings and nature of the stakeholders of Gaza War and speculate about the future of Gaza.

The true feelings and nature of Netanyahu's far-right government

Israeli parliament is operated by a completely proportional system. Therefore, there are many political parties. The current Netanyahu administration is dominated by far-right parties. They fully expose Jewish true feelings and nature.

They claim that the Jews are chosen by Yahweh (Chosen people ideology) and that the land of Israel was given to them by Yahweh long time ago. But Jews were forced out of their homeland and migrated to Europe two thousand years ago (Diaspora). They were treated with scorn and oppression there. Furthermore, during World War II, more than 10 million people were sent to gas chambers in concentration camps (Ethnic cleansing). But Jews got success in the financial field. They supported the Western Allied Forces in World War I financially. In return UK gave them their ancestral land of Israel (Balfour Declaration). They immigrated from Europe with the slogan "A land without a people for a people without land." In this phrase, Palestine soil was called "a land

without a people." But It's not true. Arabs had been there before the diaspora and then now. Slogans may be absurd at times, but as long as they have a good sound to the ear, they are used regardless of the actual situation.

After World War II, Israel became an independent nation. Israel completely crushed the neighboring Arab countries through four Middle East wars. Israel established the myth of invincibility. On the other hand, Jews constantly aroused atonement consciousness in European countries which had forced them into ghettos and ultimately suffered the throes of death in concentration camps. The Jews who immigrated to the United States controlled the politics of the United States (Jewish Lobby), which became a world superpower. They also insisted that they protected the Christian holy city of Jerusalem from Arabs and Muslims. Public opinion in the United States became full of support for Israel.

The history tells the true intentions and nature of the Israeli Netanyahu administration as follows. First, if the war is inevitable, Israel never hesitates to launch a pre-emptive strike. Secondly, they use any means necessary to defeat the enemy completely, even if most of the international opinion oppose them. For Israel, offense is the best form of defense, and victory justifies everything.

Although it was a miscalculation for Netanyahu that Hamas attacked first in the Gaza war, his government has made it clear that they will not stop fighting until it immediately retaliates and annihilates Hamas.

Israel is so bullish because they are confident that the US will never abandon them. In addition, Israel brings up Europe the idea of atonement for concentration camps, nevertheless Europe countries are becoming fed up with the dual conflicts between Gaza and Ukraine. There is no such thing as compromise for ruthless Israel.

The true intentions and nature of Western and Islamic countries



The majority of Israelis are convinced that the annihilation of the terrorist group Hamas is an essential condition for ending the war. They believe in the greatness of their country and at the same time their fathers and children are fighting on the battlefield. As everyone recognizes that victory is certain, an unconditional and immediate ceasefire would be out of the question. Timid intellectuals who simply advocate peace are eliminated and imprisoned. That's what war is like.

How about the response of the European countries, the United States and neighboring Islamic countries? They are the stakeholders in the post-war settlement of Gaza. The problem is the distinction between their words and intentions.

European countries fear that the Gaza conflict will spread to the entire Middle East, including Iran, and that this will lead to frequent Islamic terrorism outbreaks in Europe. However, without influential mediators, a pure and simple call for a humanitarian ceasefire is nonsense. That is the reality of war. Meanwhile, under the table of peace talks, advanced military powers such as the United States, France, and Germany are exporting large amounts of weapons. The defense industry is enjoying high performance. The gap between their words and true intentions is not small.

The words and true intentions of neighboring Islamic countries are much simpler. They support the independence of Palestine as an Arab-Islamic state and condemn Israel's mass murder of innocent women and children (genocide). And they will make utmost effort in providing humanitarian aid.

Palestinians want political independence and equality. But the autocratic monarchies in the Gulf, such as Saudi Arabia and the UAE, are afraid of a pincer attack from both democratized Palestine and Shiite Iran. The true opinion of the surrounding Arab countries is probably such as; Palestine maintains its flashy independence under Israeli rule with subsists on food and medical aid from neighboring countries. This is exactly same as the current situation of the Palestinian Authority in the West Bank, where lethargy and corruption are widespread.

Israel does not respond to the United Nations Security Council's call. Other country is simply advocating for two-state coexistence, but they cannot impose economic sanctions on Israel. The United States defends Israel by exercising its veto in the Security Council. The United Nations has become dysfunctional despite loudly calling out the inhumanity of Israel. Russia and China condemn Israel and the West and ask Hamas to refrain the radical actions. But they themselves do not change their attitude as bystanders. It looks like that two countries get fish in the international political arena.

What it will be? Post-war Palestine administration

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There is no doubt that Israel, with its overwhelming military power, will win the Gaza war. However, Hamas will never declare its defeat. Israel has made it clear that it will not directly rule Gaza after the war. Everyone knows that direct rule by Israel will be very risky. This war has brought anti-Israel sentiment among Gaza residents to the boil. It will likely result in a new urban guerrilla movement by Hamas remnants or radicalized youth. Iran and Syria will support them in terms of weapons. Neighboring Arab countries will support them economically. The Gulf Arab states, fearing Israeli retaliation, have no intention of sending volunteer soldiers and instead focus on providing aids and donations. This would be atonement or indulgence for the Palestinians in the rich Gulf countries.

After the war, the administration of Palestine will look exactly the same as it did before the war. Palestinians will experience "prison without a ceiling" harsher than before the war. Their life will be completely deprived of freedom in the minimum environment necessary for survival. The scenery you can watch is exactly like a concentration camp during the Nazi era. The only difference is that there are no gas chambers. Racism (apartheid) against Palestinians takes on an even harsher aspect. There will be boiling anger and despair than ever in the hearts of Palestinians.

Is there any hope for Palestinians in Gaza? Within the next few decades, there will be no bright prospects for them. The only thing I can say is that history moves on a 100-year or 1000-year span. It is difficult to imagine that the Jews will continue to prosper forever and meet the end of this world as a monotheistic "promised people."

Palestinian Arabs are also monotheistic Muslims. As the same monotheist, both Jews and Arabs should be saved in the same way at the end of the world. (Conversely, monotheists may say that all humans other than them, such as polytheistic Hindus, Buddhists and communists will experience the torments of hell at the end of this world.)

But everything is subject to change. Pride goes before a fall. The life is limited. Today's "good" may change "bad" tomorrow. There is no absolute in the world.

The readers will dissatisfy that the conclusion is too irresponsible and dark. It may offend readers. I, however, want to avoid the self-absorption of liberalists who easily expect peace.

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
